Her first novel, *Carry the Sky*, (Forest Avenue Press, 2014) attempts to stare at bullying without blinking. Her first full-length book of poems, *Another Sunset We Survive* (2007) was a finalist for the Oregon Book Award and followed chapbooks, *Bone-Knowing* (2006), winner of the Gertrude Press Poetry Prize and *Where She Goes* (2000), winner of the Blue Light Chapbook Prize. She's been awarded residencies at Hedgbrook, Norcroft, and Soapstone, and a fellowship from the Oregon Literary Arts. Volunteering for Write Around Portland, she facilitates writing groups for female inmates in a correctional facility. She lives in a purple house in Portland, Oregon with her sidekicks, Rafi and Wasco, and is a teacher and writing coach.
